

Sabla Scheme: Reaching The Adolescent Girls

Abstract : In Indian context, adolescent girls are vulnerable to physical and educational neglect. Malnutrition is more common in India with over 90% of young girls reported as anaemic. Academically, adolescent girls (AGs) have a much higher rate of school dropout than boys. Such neglect becomes an impediment to the progress of young girls and women in society. The RGSEAG (Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls) introduced SABLA program in November, 2010 by the Govt of India under the ministry of women and child development department and works to combat these issues by focusing on educational, nutritional and health requirements.
